

### BETWEEN THE LINES By Superintendent Jeff Walburn

POLITICS, STATE and FEDERAL LEGISLATION does affect small local schools such as HDC. On the national government level; the gridlock between Democrats and Republicans, not only has debilitated every facet of our government including education. Educators and schools are entrenched in multiple unfunded mandates for the sake of "accountability" without quantitative measurements. The *No Child Left Behind (NCLB)* referendum was a failure from its inception and it was up for reauthorization from Congress eight years ago. There has been recent movement to this end but politics has stagnated the legislation for nearly a decade.

I bring this topic up because in the very near future I will send out letters to our elementary parents and also place the letter on our school's website specific to Title I. We are deemed as "Needs Improvement" with regard to our reading NeSA scores. Ironically, our scores have improved from the 2013-14 test year to the 2014-15 testing year. I suggest "ironic" because I believe that improvement is success. For that reason I believe that our MAPS testing that we administer twice a year is a much more valid test that demonstrates individual student achievement and improvement. Student success is demonstrated in growth and improvement.

Presently, nearly 75% of Nebraska schools are deemed as "Needs Improvement" because as we entered 2014, the *NCLB* required that 100% of the students taking the NeSA test had to be "Proficient". One child in each of the testing grades that performs below proficient may qualify the school as "Needs Improvement". Impossible over multiple years. If *NCLB* remains as it is, within a couple of years virtually every school in the nation will be considered as "Needs Improvement". The fallacy of our legislators thinking many years ago! The real failure and "Needs Improvement" is in Washington D.C.

THANKSGIVING: With the advent of November upon us, I remind you as I remind myself to live with gratitude in your heart. Thanksgiving has always been my favorite holiday. It is a time for reflection and a time to prioritize what is truly important to us.
