During the day members evaluated beef, swine and sheep classes of animals, answered oral questions, took a written test and gave oral reasons. As the results were released, the chapter learned that the Senior Judging Team of Regan Burenheide, Trevor Schumacher, Logan Nelson and Audrey Coufal took home 2nd Place Team Honors. Individually Regan took home 4th place, Trevor 5th and Audrey 6th out of 86 total individuals. In the Junior Division, Jacob Hegemann, Gavin Nelson, Blake Sindelar and Levi Belina brought home 3rd Place Team Honors (Jacob placed 5th, Gavin 7th, Levi 10th, Blake 11th). Both of these teams will advance to the State Livestock Judging Contest held in Lincoln in April during the State FFA Convention.

This year, our P2T (Pathways to tomorrow) program provides students with the opportunity to take classes in Health Science, Education, Computer Science, Building Construction, and Welding/CDL. Students are able to take classes for dual credit, meaning they could get college credit during high school toward the career of their choice. 
