The Howells-Dodge Jaguars fell just short against Stanton, falling 36-42. The Jaguars started off the game with a strong drive, but it finished in a turnover. The first quarter ended with a score of 8-0 in favor of Stanton. The Jaguars would be dominant in the 2nd quarter scoring on their first 3 drives, making the halftime score 20-14.

The 3rd quarter was hard fought. After the Jaguars stopped the Mustangs on the first drive, Levi Belina punched in his 4th touchdown run of the night. That put the Jaguars up 28-14 part of the way into the 3rd quarter. The Mustangs wouldn't back down. They scored on their next two drives to tie up the score heading into the 4th.

The start of the 4th quarter didn't go quite as planned for the Jaguars. After a quick 3 and out, the Mustangs scored almost instantly, making the score 34-28. The following possession, Levi Belina took in a long touchdown run - his 5th of the night! The score was 36-34 Jaguars. The Mustangs offense proved too much for the Jags on the ensuing possession. Gage Tighe of the Mustangs punched in his 4th touchdown of the night. The score being 42-36 Mustangs. The final possession for the Jaguars ended in an interception, making the final score 42-36 in favor of Stanton.

Jacob Tomcak led in passing with 41 yards. Levi Belina led the team rushing with 314 yards and 5 touchdowns. Lance Brester led the team receiving with 25 yards. The tackle leader for the Jags was Jestin Bayer with 15.

The Jaguars faced GACC on Friday, October 9. They defeated the Bluejays 36-16. They will then cap off the regular season in the Bacon Bowl against Clarkson-Leigh. The opening round of the NSAA playoffs will be on Thursday, October 22.

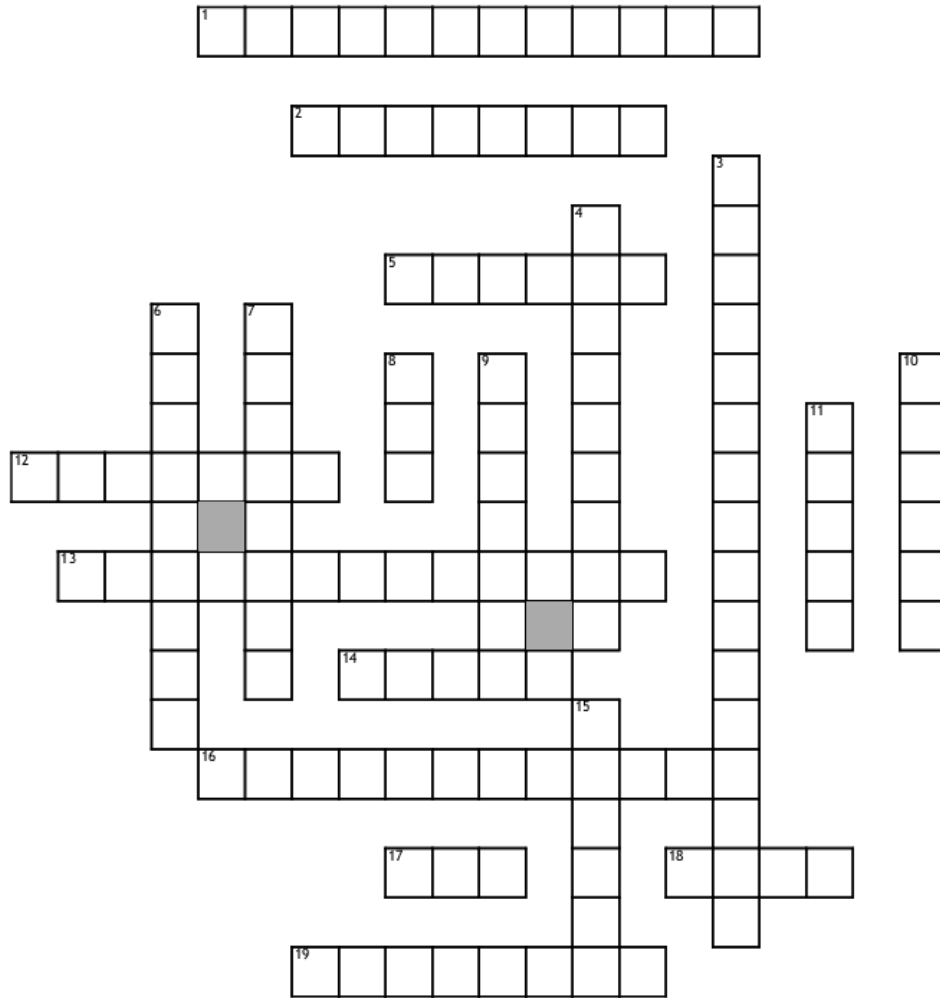
